If we follow best practices now, we can ensure long-term advantages for all students, especially those who are often marginalized."

Powered by Every Learner's partner, the International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE), the Expert Network is comprised of equity experts from across the country. The launch of this flexible coaching program comes at a time when higher education faculty and leaders need additional guidance through the COVID-19 crisis, including the massive migration of face-to-face instruction to online learning. According to recent Every Learner surveys, while faculty feel better prepared for digital instruction now than they did for the Spring 2020 semester, they still report substantial needs for quality, ongoing support, especially with respect to equity.

"The challenges of 2020 for educators and leaders in both K-12 and higher education are unprecedented, but disruption can pave the way for innovation," stated ISTE Chief Learning Officer Joseph South.
